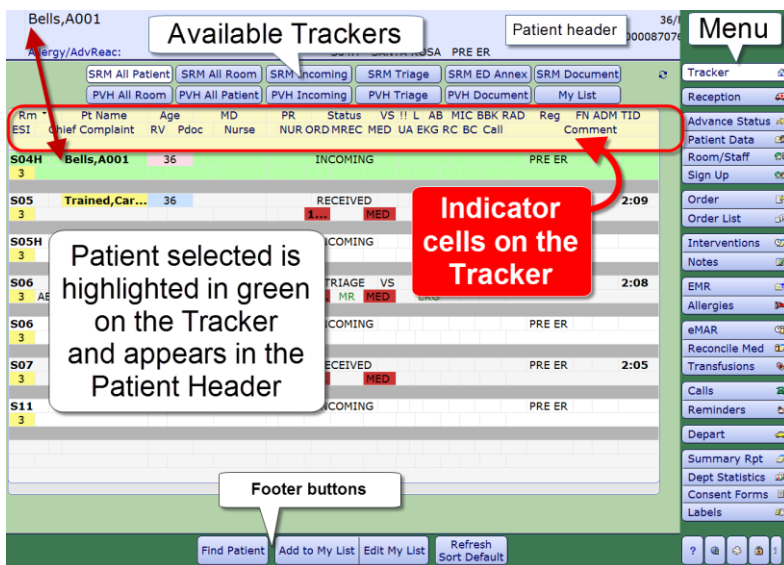


ED Tracker

Tracker and Tracker Indicators (Page 1 of 2)



Each ministry may not use all of these indicator cells on their Tracker

ADM	Indicates Admitting physician entered an Admit order.
Age	Displays the patient age. Blue = male patient. Pink = female patient.
A...or M...	Opens the EMR
ABG	Status of arterial blood gas testing.
BBK	Indicates there are blood bank orders.
BC	Blood Culture. Indicates a blood culture has been orderd.
Call	Indicates a call has been documented. Click the Calls menu button to review.
CCDA	Continuing Care Documentation Accepted (will link to Calls).
CCDR	Continuing Care Documentation Received (will link to Calls).
Chief Complaint	Displays Chief Complaint entered in Triage. Determines assessments and treatments that will populate on the Interventions screen to document.
CM	Case Management Order Status.
Comment	Displays any comments added by the ED healthcare team.
EKG	Indicates an EKG has been ordered.
Event	Shows time that has elapsed since the last Patient Status change.
UA	Indicates a urinalysis has been ordered.
VS	VS appears when vital signs are documented. Click in the cell to open EMR.

F	Displays a yellow F for documented moderate or high risk fall assessment.																		
FN	Financial Number: Green cell with a Y = patient has been cleared by Registration. A red cell with N = patient has not been cleared by Registration and needs follow up before they leave. A Y must display to depart the patient.

1	Red	Resuscitation

L/AB	Works with the AB cell. Red text = lab order placed. Yellow = in process. One result, the L turns green. When all results are available, AB turns green.																		
MD	Displays the name of the provider who signed up for the patient.																		
MED	Alerts the user that the patient has medication orders.																		
MREC	Red MR displays if med rec is not complete. MR in green when complete.																		
Nurse	Displays the name of the nurse who signed up for the patient.																		
NUR or IS	Click cell to open Interventions to document Assessments and Treatments.																		
ORD	Patient has orders. Red indicates action needs to be taken on the orders.																		
Pdoc	Physician documentation status: Draft, Signed, In Process, or Canceled.																		
Psych	Patient is being held/secluded in the ED and may not leave.																		
Pt Name	Displays patient name. Yellow background: name is similar to another patient.																		
RAD	Radiology orders. Color coded. TKN=Light green (exam taken but not resulted).																		
RC	Respiratory Care has been ordered.																		
Reg	<p>Displays the patient registration status for this visit.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pre ER - Not Registered • Reg ER – Registered • ADM IN - Admitted • ADM OBS - Observation • REG SDC - Same Day Care 																		
Rm	Displays the patient's room number																		
Status	Displays the Event Status. Examples: Roomed, MD Exam																		
TID	Time in Department: Number of minutes the patient has been in the ED.																		
UA	Indicates a urinalysis has been ordered.																		
VS	VS appears when the vital signs have been documented. Double-click on the cell to go to the EMR to review.																		
!!	CRITICAL ALERT !! displays with a red background if the patient has a critical value.
